Unpacking our Purpose

Before you were born, God sat down with you and told you about your future. As He told you of your forthcoming events, He wrote this information in a book in Heaven. Not unlike all of God's activities, this one had a purpose. As God formed you in the womb, He wrote into your DNA every element of your physical and mental attributes. I believe He also established the information needed to develop your soul from the book He had previously written. As we entered this adventure we call physical life, this information was to be unpacked by the Holy Spirit as needed for our future success.

Psalms 139:16 AMPC

(16) Your eyes saw my unformed substance, and in Your book all the days [of my life] were written before ever they took shape, when as yet there was none of them.

Our true identity is the person that God has established us to be, not who we think we are. Through communion with the Holy Spirit and agreement with Him, He reveals to us who He says we are and His purpose for our lives. Some guidelines in the Bible identify God's revelation of our identity and purpose to us. But, of course, everyone's complete identity is not given; it must be revealed as we experience our lives.

Luke discusses the generations of Jesus that came before Adam. Here Luke tells us that Adam was the son of God.

Luke 3:38 KJV

(38) Which was the son of Enos, which was the son of Seth, which was the son of Adam, which was the son of God.

When he rebelled against God, Adam lost his dominion, authority, and lordship to Satan. However, He did not lose his sonship. He was still the son of God, as were all of his descendants, including Jesus and all other people born on earth. However, Satan soon blinded the minds of people, and this knowledge was lost. Finally, Jesus came to return this information to all who would believe. In one place, Jesus told a story that paints a picture of a prodigal son returning to his father. It is also a wonderful picture of our Father's love and acceptance of those who strayed from Him and are living in spiritual, mental, and physical poverty, held captive by circumstances.

Luke 15:11-24 KJV

(11) And he said, A certain man had two sons:

(12) And the younger of them said to his father, Father, give me the portion of goods that falleth to me And he divided unto them his living.

(13) And not many days after the younger son gathered all together, and took his journey into a far country, and there wasted his substance with riotous living.

(14) And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want.

(15) And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine

(16) And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him.

(17) And when he came to himself, he said, How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger!

(18) I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee

(19) And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired serv(20) And he arose, and came to his father But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him.

(21) And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son.

(22) But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet:

(23) And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry:

24) For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found And they began to be merry.

First, I would like to point out that the son felt unqualified to be called a son. He wished to be only a servant. Believing we are expressing humility, we often think the same way. Part of our acceptance of Jesus is to accept His viewpoint on everything, including sonship. The Father looks for His sons to return to Him, not servants. Our refusal to agree with Him reveals our continuing rebellion against Him. According to God, our identity is "we are His sons." We must accept this identity.

Galatians 4:7 KJV

(7) Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

The father in the story kissed the son, revealing his great love for him. Jesus died to show us the great love God has for us. Through Jesus, we are rooted and grounded in that love. Practicing the love of God results in our morality, as we keep the law. Godly people never have a sin problem; breaking the law is a love problem. Again, if we preach to godly people about breaking the law, we rebel against God. He said that when love leads us, we obediently follow; this fulfills the law. We must learn to be led by the spirit of love.

The father placed the robe of righteousness on his son, indicating that he had restored him to his right standing in the family. So likewise, Jesus restored us to holiness with our Father and His family. Therefore, we must not rebel against the Father's opinion; instead, we accept, believe, and walk in His righteousness.

The father placed the signet ring on his son's hand, signifying that all the father had was his. Then, the father returned the authority to buy and sell in his father's name. The Father returns the authority lost by Adam to us; we can do business in the Father's name again. God gave Adam dominion over the earth; Jesus walked in that same dominion and returned it to us.

The father then placed shoes on his son's feet, indicating that his walk had permanently changed. He was no longer a feeder of pigs but was of the father's household and lived with the father. He no longer had to beg and fight for food scraps, but could sit freely at His father's table. His father furnished everything that he needed to live. Our Father has given us everything we need for life and godliness because we are His sons. Therefore, God has permanently altered our walk with Him. We cannot walk in any direction we please. Still, we must be led by the Spirit within us and walk as He wills. Any other walk indicates that a rebellious spirit is still controlling us.

John 8:35 KJV

(35) And the servant abideth not in the house for ever: but the Son abideth ever.

Our purpose is to remember that we are His children. We are not servants; nevertheless, we serve as sons.

Prayer

Father, because I want to become your obedient son, I yield myself before you, crying out, "Abba Father, I have come to do thy will." As your son, I need to know that I am walking in the righteousness you have provided me. My heart desires to practice the dominion and authority of your son over this piece of earth I call my body. I want the Kingdom of God to manifest your glory within me, expressing Heaven's rule. Please teach me how to listen to the spirit of God

Becoming a Son

We become a child of God by being born again of the Spirit into the Kingdom of God.

Colossians 1:13 KJV

(13) Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son:

We are born into the family of God. Just because you were born into a family as a child does not automatically make you a mature man or woman. That takes growth. In the Bible, when a child comes of age and becomes a man, the parents refer to him as their son, thereby acknowledging his attaining maturity. God did this for His son, Jesus, soon after His Baptism by John the Baptist. He said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased." So, God's title "Son" reveals that Jesus had matured. Galatians 4:1-7 speaks of the child becoming a son.

John 1:12 KJV

(12) But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:

John was clear-cut in this verse of scripture. We are not born sons, as the writers used this term in the Bible. Instead, we are born children with the power to become the sons of God.

Romans 8:14 KJV

For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

Love is the Spirit of God, or as the Bible states, God is love. God's love for us constrains us, leads us, and is essential to come to the full maturity of sonship.

The Apostle Paul puts further stipulations on becoming a son of God.

Galatians 2:20 KJV

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

He increases the requirements in this verse: "We have Christ in us." We are in Him. That means we are one person. We live, move, and have our being in Him,

the Son of God. We do not have a private relationship with the Father, but enter into Jesus's relationship with the Father as Him. We can only reach the level of maturity we are willing to receive through faith and daily practice.

Secured in God's covenant and appearing as Him in His relationship with the Father, we are in Him and impervious to enemy attacks. The enemy can only invade as far as we let him.
